Dear Pebbles Supporters,

This Christmas, as we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus in a stable, our thoughts go to those who face the challenges of living in the Wabigalo slum of Kamapala. Last week, at the end of the academic year Choice Baptist Nursery and Primary school had a big celebration to mark the achievements of the children. The whole community were invited for food music, dancing and preaching and had a wonderful time.

Since we started Pebbles- Uganda in 2013 your support has enabled the church and school to feed hundreds of children. With our help, the school and church have provided running and clean drinking water to the site along with flush toilets. During COVID and the following years, our support enabled many families to take the first steps out of poverty through a Back to Work scheme. This provided a fund from which loans were taken to start or expand businesses. About 40 families have been helped and the scheme continues.

Although it is with sadness that Pebbles- Uganda will be closing in 2026, the folk in Wabigalo have a lot to be proud of. We trust in God and the people of Choice Baptist Church to continue the work and for it to become sustainable.

We will send Pr Alex any surplus funds early in the new year with a view to closing the charity and the bank account by the end of our financial year in June.

It has been a privilege to stand with Pr Alex in the valuable work to which he has been called. The time has come for him and his team to manage the school and church without our help. He has shown remarkable dedication and innovation in the past, and we pray that with God's help he will be able to continue the work in the future.
